## Easy Steps to Lawn Renovation

If your lawn has deteriorated to the extent that routine practices—mowing, fertilizing, watering and controlling weeds and pests—do not give the desired response, it's probably time to replace it. Follow these steps to a create a lush and beautiful lawn.

- Step 1: Mix Roundup Concentrate Weed & Grass Killer at a rate of 6 ounces per gallon of water or Roundup Super Concentrate Weed & Grass Killer at a rate of 2½ ounces per gallon of water. Since Roundup is absorbed by weeds and grasses, skip one mowing before spraying.
- Step 2: Spray the entire lawn area to be replaced evenly with Roundup. If any green patches remain after seven days, reapply Roundup. A second application can treat dense turf like Bermuda grass or tough-to-control weeds.
- Step 3: Prepare the area for reseeding by removing the old grass and weeds with a power rake. Lay down a fresh layer of topsoil and rake to level. Select a Scotts grass seed adapted to your area and broadcast it evenly over the topsoil.
- Step 4: Watering frequently, rather than deeply, is best. Use a hose and sprinkler to water your lawn. Only the top inch or so needs to be kept moist.
- Step 5: Mowing can begin as soon as there is growth to cut with a mower set at about 2½–3 inches high. Do not mow when the soil is overly wet, as it can damage the young plants. Make sure the mower blades are sharp; the young grass plants can be easily pulled from the soil by dull blades.
- Step 6: Apply a follow-up application of Turf Builder Lawn.
