General Show Rules

- 12-month negative coggins test required to enter grounds.
- Horse and rider age is determined by age on January 1.
- Age Divisions
 Walk/trot Youth 11 & under, may not enter canter/lope classes
 Junior Youth 13 & under, may not enter Youth Walk/trot classes

Senior Youth - 14-18 Adult - 19 & over

- Halter classes must have a minimum of 3 horses. Otherwise class will be shown as "all ages."
- Classes must be within one age division to qualify for All Day fee.
- Youth walk/trot riders may not enter any other classes that require loping/cantering.
- English Attire: Tall boots or paddock boots, coat, and helmet.
- Western Attire: Long sleeved collared shirt, hat, and boots with a heel.
- Tack: AQHA rules apply.
- AQHA rules apply when not otherwise covered and show management decisions are final.

Class Descriptions

Halter: An in-hand class that evaluates a horse's confirmation. Horse must be shown in a halter and lead only. Chain on lead shank is optional.

Showmanship: An in-hand class that evaluates an exhibitor's ability to maneuver and present a horse through a prescribed pattern.

Hunter Under Saddle: A rail class in English tack and attire that evaluates horse's manner and movement. Exhibitors will be asked to walk, trot and canter both directions of the ring.

Hunt Seat Equation: A pattern class in English tack and attire that evaluates rider's ability to maneuver horse while maintaining proper body position.

Hunter Command: A rail class in English tack and attire that demonstrates the horse's skill level through a series of commands called by the judge.

Western Pleasure: A rail class in Western tack and attire that evaluates horse's manner and movement. Exhibitors will be asked to walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring.

Jackpot Western Pleasure: Winner takes 50% of the jackpot.

Western Horsemanship: A pattern class in Western tack and attire that evaluates rider's ability to maneuver horse while maintaining proper body position.

RCC Equestrian Draw Horsemanship: Standard Horsemanship class where riders draw a RCC horse to show. Riders will be placed on the scholarship watch list.

Western Command: A rail class in Western tack and attire that demonstrates the horse's skill level through a series of commands called by the judge.

Ranch Horse Pleasure: A pattern class in western tack and attire. AQHA standards apply.

Reining: NRHA standards apply.

Barrels: Timed event. BBR standards apply.

Poles and Stake Race: Timed event. AQHA standard pattern.
