Meat Production Varieties:

Jumbo Cornish Rock Cross: Straight Run Only! (No sexing available)

One of the finest quality broiler type chicks found anywhere.

Many people report 4 pound broilers in as little as 7-8 weeks.

They give you the desired broad breast, big legs, and thighs with rich yellow skin.

Freedom Rangers: Straight Run Only! (No sexing available)

A slow growing broiler that is well suited to be raised free range, or organically.

They have rich yellow skin, strong legs and dark red feathering.

Expect market weight at approx. 10 weeks.

Egg Production Varieties: Pullets-Female

Please understand there is no guarantee of the sex of poultry

Black Sex Link:

They are excellent brown-egg layers, known for their extra-large or jumbo eggs.

The adult females are a beautiful black with reddish plumage, particularly around the neck.

They are a result of mating a Rhode Island Red Male and a Barred Rock Female.

Rhode Island Red:

If you are striving for the "peak" in egg production and still want a heavy bird with good market capabilities these are the bird for you. They are well known for their red feathers and superior ability to lay large brown eggs.

Golden Comet:

They mature early and lay brown eggs of excellent size and quality. They are an extremely quiet bird that can withstand the colder, non-insulated laying houses of the small flock-owner better than other breeds.

Barred Plymouth Rock:

This is one of the oldest and most selected strains of Barred Rock in the United States. A black and white feathered bird that is known to be a good choice for show, and for their production of large brown eggs.

Turkey Varieties: These are only available for the May & June Delivery Dates

Straight run (mixed males & females) only!

Mammoth Bronze:

They are handsome, colorful birds that attract attention when seen.

Hens average 18-20 Pounds, and Toms average 30 Pounds.

Broad Breasted Whites:

They are an extra good, compact meat type bird that dresses out well at almost any size with a pleasantly plump carcass. They are a favorite of many because they look beautiful dressed.
