Do Mosquito Eaters Eat Mosquitos?

Have you seen more Crane Flies (commonly known as mosquito eaters) around than usual? There are a lot of them, but the name mosquito eater is a bit deceptive.

Despite their common name, crane flies do not prey on mosquitoes as adults, nor do they bite humans. Adult crane flies feed on nectar or they do not feed at all. You see, once they become adults, most crane fly species exist only to mate and die. Their larvae, called "leatherjackets", " leatherbacks", "leatherback bugs" or "leatherjacket slugs", consume roots (such as those of turf grass) and other vegetation, in some cases causing damage to plants. The crane fly is occasionally considered a mild turf pest in some areas. For example, in 1935, Lord's Cricket Ground in London was among the venues affected by leatherjackets. Several thousand of the little creatures were collected by ground staff and burned because they caused bald patches on the pitch.*******************

Be on the lookout for hoof issues with all this rain. Here's some issues to keep in mind if you have outside animals.

Thrush is a common problem, especially when rainy weather persists. It can become painful and debilitating for your horse or pony if left untreated. Learn to recognize the signs, how to cure it yourself with inexpensive products and how to avoid occurrences of thrush. **Question:** How do I know my horse has thrush?

Answer: You will quickly recognize thrush if you find a black, moist, foul smelling substance when you clean out the hooves. The thrush will likely be hiding in the deeper areas of the cleft. The smell of thrush is unmistakable. As you clean the hoof the black substance will scrape out but leave dark staining.

Organisms that cause hoof rot thrive in moist conditions. Fusobacterium necrophorum and Dichelobacter nodosus cause hoofneedbe on the lookout for lame animals. Examine their hooves. Foul-smelling odors, heat and inflammation at the coronary band where the hoof adjoins the pastern and pain are common signs of the disease. A vaccine against hoof rot is available for sheep but not for goats.

Dr. Fernandez advises trimming the hoof to remove damaged or dead tissue and then treating the affected hoof
